A mother and grandmother talk with a TVI about questions they want answered in their upcoming visit to the eye care specialist. The grandmother has questions concerning the use of corrective lenses.

Family Reactions Following Visual Diagnosis VCM 1-02

In this clip from *Breaking the News* produced by the Institute for Families of Blind Children, a mother discusses her need for informational and emotional support from the

eye care specialist after receiving the diagnosis of her son's visual condition. A father shares his thoughts on the eye care specialist's role in providing hope for families.

Assisting Families to Understand the Diagnosis VCM 1-03

In this clip from *Breaking the News* produced by the Institute for Families of Blind Children, a pediatric ophthalmologist shares her personal reflections about telling a family devastating news concerning a child's visual diagnosis. She specifically discusses the fear families have and how specialists want to help families. She also discusses how families need to repeatedly hear information as they learn to cope and accept the diagnosis and treatment of specific eye conditions.

Communicating With Families of a Different Language VCM 1-04

In this clip from *Just Being Kids*, produced by L. Edelman and Mark Herlinger Productions, Inc., a Hispanic mother describes the importance of the Spanish language in helping her understand her child's unique needs. She shares her concerns about misunderstanding or failure to receive vital information when specialists cannot communicate in Spanish.

Interpreter Guidelines VCM 1-05

In this clip from *A Three-way Conversation* produced by S. Moore and Mark Herlinger Productions, Inc., a woman explains the various conflicts that may arise when using interpreters including what may happen if a family chooses to hire their own interpreter. She discusses the need for interpreters to be familiar with terminology professionals use when talking with families.

TVIs as Liaisons VCM 1-06

A TVI provides informational support to an eye care specialist regarding NoIR sunglasses for a young child. The eye care specialist asks questions and then discusses his concern for providing the young child with appropriate protection for her eyes.

Observation of Child Visual Behaviors VCM 1-07

In this series of clips, a toddler visually explores toys and interacts with an adult. The toddler is also seen walking outside in the sunshine.

Observation of Child Eye Exam VCM 1-08

During a visit to the pediatric ophthalmologist, a mother and a TVI talk to the doctor while he conducts a routine eye exam on a little girl with Peter's anomaly.
