

Snapshot of Diversity in Durham

- **The ethnicity of college students in our community varies tremendously**
 - 2001 demographics at North Carolina Central University
 - 81.3 % African-Americans
 - 13.8% Whites
 - 3% Hispanics/Latinos, American Indians or Asians
 - Fall 2000 demographics at Durham Technical Community College
 - 46% Whites
 - 45% African-Americans
 - 5% Asians
 - 2% Hispanics-Latinos
 - 2% Other
 - 2001 demographics at Duke University
 - 71% Whites
 - 13% Asians
 - 8% African-Americans
 - 4% Hispanics-Latinos
 - 4% Other
- **Children & families in our communities are increasingly diverse**
 - Durham residents
 - 48.1% Whites
 - 39.2% African-Americans
 - 7.6% Hispanics/Latinos
 - 3.3% Asians
 - 1.8% Others
 - The 2000 Census found a 730% increase in the Hispanic-Latino population of Durham County. Hispanics/Latinos make up a larger percentage of Durham County's population than in any other of the state's most populous counties.
 - Infants and toddlers served in 2000 were more diverse than ever
 - 57.5% Whites
 - 33.7% African-Americans
 - 4.1% Hispanics/Latinos
 - 2.7% Asians
 - 1.5% American Indians
